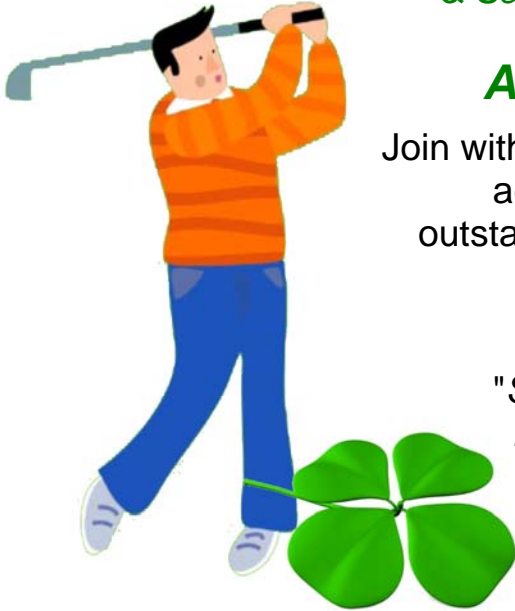

Golfer Itinerary

Aug 14 Today, Tap Room at Dubsdread and Sam Snead's Oak and Grill friends will depart from Orlando on Delta Airlines for your overnight flight to Dublin. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you start your trip for your exciting vacation on "the old sod", Ireland.

Aug 15 Awake to see the Emerald Isle just outside your aircraft window. Once you arrive and complete the customs and immigration formalities, your driver/guide will welcome you to Ireland and escort you along with your luggage to your awaiting motor coach. Because check-in at your hotel is later in the day, you'll be taken on an orientation drive around Dublin City center to ingratiate you to the area. Dublin is one of the liveliest capitols in Europe, steeped in history and historical sites to visit. You'll see the main thoroughfares of O'Connell Street and Nassau Street, the shopping streets and pass by some lovely public parks. You'll stop for a visit at the Guinness Storehouse to see exhibits on how this world famous stout was first created and why it is so popular today. Then, what better way to be welcomed to Ireland than to finish your visit in the roof-top bar, *Gravity*, than with a draft of Guinness stout! The Guinness building is shaped like a pint of Guinness in a mug and the Gravity bar is the "head" of the pint of stout. Take in the spectacular views of Dublin from this 360 degree glass window perspective at the *Gravity* bar. By now, your hotel rooms will be ready for your check-in. After you settle into your room, you may like to rest or for the adventurous, explore some of the city on your own (they speak our language don't you know.). Later this evening, join your friends for a welcome drink followed by dinner at your hotel.

Aug 16 After breakfast today, you will be taken to play your first round of golf at Portmarnock, a 72 par championship course. Universally acknowledged as one of the truly great links courses, Portmarnock is situated to the north side of Dublin, about 12 miles from the city centre. Its quality and location have made it a splendid venue for some of the game's great events, from the British Amateur Championship of 1949, to the Canada Cup in 1960. Quite apart from the other championship tournaments, Portmarnock hosted the 1991 Walker Cup and was a 12 time venue for the revived Irish Open. Within the curve of the coastline, formed by the Howth peninsula, Portmarnock offers stunning views of Ireland's Eye and the Lambay Island, rising sharply from deep waters. But above all, Portmarnock's charm is the delightful turf, the wildness, the solitude of the sand hills and the sea, and the ever-present challenge of the wind that makes this course so special to all golfers. After your round of golf, you will return to your hotel where the balance of the day and evening are free to tell tall golf tales of your days golfing experiences.

Aug 17 After breakfast, you will leave Dublin on your journey through the prosperous farming country and marketing towns of the midland region of Ireland. Stop for photos at the Rock of Cashel, a stately limestone outcrop topped with medieval church ruins. Continue south past the gentle slopes of the Galtee Mountains to visit Blarney Castle. You may climb to the battlements to acquire the "gift of eloquence" by kissing the famous Blarney stone. If you already have the "gift of eloquence", you will instead have time to visit the Blarney Woolen Mills, adjacent to Blarney Castle, which has an excellent range of Irish products sure to please all shoppers' tastes. Now imbued with the "stone of eloquence" blessing, you will be off, traveling through the rugged countryside of County Kerry where the town of Killarney is located and is your next stop. Killarney is charmingly situated against a backdrop of mountains and lakes. After arrival, and check-in at your hotel, you will have time to relax and settle in before joining your group for dinner.

Aug 18 After you are fortified by your breakfast, you will be taken to play two inland championship golf courses, Mahony's Point and Killeen, both located on the shores of Killarney's lakes. Mahoney's Point was founded in 1891 and Killeen was established in 1971. The Mahoney's course is a par 72 and the Killeen course is a par 69 course. The Killarney Golf Club, situated in an area known as "Heaven's Reflex", a name that is derived from its location of outstanding beauty, is comprised of three top class courses in a parkland layout. You will play the top two, the Killeen Course and Mahony's Point Course. It is the Killeen Course however, closely followed by Mahony's Point, which is perceived to be the jewel in the Killarney golfing crown. Nestled amidst the splendor of the Lakes of Killarney in the shadow of the majestic Macgillycuddy's Reeks mountain range, the Killeen Course is consistently rated among the world's top courses and has hosted many major championships including the 1991 & 1992 Irish Open Golf Championship, won by Nick Faldo on both occasions and also hosted the 1996 Curtis Cup. Mahoney's Point is a superb course which will offer a challenge to every level of golfer. On a windy day, this course could cause a headache for even the most professional golfer. Although it is technically shorter than the Killeen course, do not expect a short walk, as this is by no means simply a pitch and putt course. You will return to your hotel exhilarated by this day's Irish golfing experience. The evening is free for independent activities and dining.

Aug 19

After you have finished your breakfast this morning, you will depart Killarney and travel north through the village of Listowel to Tarbert where you will take the Tarbert Ferry, for an approximate 20-minute ride across the River Shannon estuary. Once across, you will continue driving along the coastline of County Clare to view the Cliffs of Moher. These ancient cliffs, reaching almost 700 feet in height, greet the writhing Atlantic Ocean as it crashes against their primordial cliffs. The Cliffs of Moher are one of the country's most magnificent rock formations, filled with beauty and mystery. Listen!!! Can you hear the sounds of an Irish whistle in the distance? Many believe that they can indeed hear the Leprechaun's, playing their Irish whistles here or see ghosts of Norman soldiers standing guard next to the ruin of the Norman Tower on the hill. After this breathtaking and mystical experience, you will be on your way to Galway. Your drive will pass through Burren Country, an area of rocky limestone hills where only a number of indigenous flowers can thrive. This area contains many dolmens which are prehistoric monuments formed by large limestone slabs. You'll continue your drive around the famed Galway Bay before arriving at your hotel in Galway. Enjoy the balance of the afternoon at leisure to relax or do some exploring on your own before joining your group for dinner.

After your breakfast this morning, you will travel from Galway to the center of Ireland for a tour of Locke's Distillery. Locke's was established in 1757 and today it is no longer used, however it is preserved to show visitors how whiskey was distilled there 350 years ago. At the end of the tour, you'll sample some of Locke's famous Irish Whiskey. Continue through farming country and marketing towns to the village of Dunboyne, located just North West of Dublin, where your hotel for the last night is located. Arrive in time to enjoy some of the hotel facilities or just relax in the elegant surroundings. In the evening, join your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner in the hotel restaurant followed by an evening of Country Irish Disco.
